

Parking on the Highway

Some people are parking vehicles on the road, preventing residents getting in and out of their drives and also causing inconvenience to other road users.

See over for tips on safe parking...



To make sure you don't cause problems:

Do not park:

- on a footway or verge
- where the kerb has been lowered
- within 10 metres of a junction
- where it will obstruct other road users
- at night:
 - facing oncoming traffic without lights on roads where the speed limit is more than 30mph
 - without lights if your vehicle weighs more than 1,525kg unladen (ie 30cwt approx).

Tips on safe Parking

Remember...

The highway is for the free flow and passage of moving vehicles.

If you park on the road:

- **Do it** correctly, with all wheels on the roadway;
- **Do not** inconvenience other road and footway users.
- If you have a driveway, please **use it**
- Correctly parked vehicles on the highway can help to reduce other vehicles' speed.
- Your co-operation is essential, to make North Lincolnshire roads safer.
